Understanding PDPM and Drivers of Success: Are You Ready for the Transition?

Presented by Kathleen Weissberg, OTD, OTR/L, CMDC, CDP, Education Director, Select Rehabilitation

The Patient-Driven Payment Model (PDPM) is the proposed new Medicare payment rule for skilled nursing facilities. It is intended to replace the current RUG-IV system with a completely new way of calculating reimbursement. Under PDPM, therapy minutes are removed as the basis for payment in favor of resident classifications and anticipated resource needs during the course of a patient's stay. PDPM assigns every resident a case-mix classification that drives the daily reimbursement rate for that individual.

The new payment system will be unlike anything SNFs have seen before! You and your staff have a lot to do to get ready. With a proposed October 2019 implementation date, it's important to start laying the groundwork now for the changes. Some of your keys to success include understanding the new model, ensuring accurate coding of the MDS, communicating with upstream partners to accurately reflect comorbidities and conditions that affect payment, improving patient outcomes, documenting skilled interventions, and preparing adequately for the transition. This session will review the basics of PDPM and discuss the key drivers of success including ICD-10 and MDS coding, NTA costs, MDS interviews, relevant updates from CMS, and case scenarios of financial impact to providers.

At the conclusion of this session the participant should be able to: Review the components, MDS changes, and key features that will impact payment under the Patient Driven Payment Model; Identify key operational considerations for

successful transition to PDPM; and Review coding considerations necessary for successful transition to PDPM including financial impact.

Look Out for Falling Stars: Understanding CMS's 2019 Changes to the Five Star Rating System

CMS announced sweeping changes to the Five Star Quality Rating System, effective in April 2019. These changes were significant and realigned the data and calculations used to assign star ratings and impacted all the domains used in the overall rating. This session will review the updated resources and guides, changes to the three domains and how this impacts your five-star rating. Participants will also review and discuss strategies for monitoring and improving your five-star rating.

At the conclusion of this session the participant should be able to: Recognize how the overall composite measure score is calculated; Understand what resources to use to calculate stars for each domain; Recognize how changes to the "cut point" calculations in the QM domain impacts your star rating; and Identify how stars can be lost or gained in the staffing domain.

Dealing with the Current Opioid "Crisis" and the Use of Psychotropics with Dementia Residents and the DD Population
Presented by Craig Sever, BS, R.Ph., Clinical Coordinator, Everspring Pharmacy

This session will provide information on dealing with the increased opioid issues in LTC and how to better insure that as a group we do not contribute to the problem. Strategies would include better inventory control, staff education, and use of better tracking programs such as those provided by state agencies and CMS.

The various types of dementia and treatment options will be discussed. Included in this presentation will be a discussion on how to better deal with our aging DD population and provide better assessment of their needs to ensure that any medical causes are ruled out before starting anti-psychotic/psychotropic medication.

At the conclusion of this session the participant should be able to: Implement better inventory controls to prevent Opioid diversion; Identify dementia and specific treatments; and Be able to better triage and assess the DD population to rule out medical issues prior to the use of Anti-Psychotics.
